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Response to family questionnaire

Thank you to all families who took the time to take our questionnaire; we had 131 responses representing 167 children. We very much value your opinions and in the main the responses provide a positive picture.

130 out of 131 responses believe their child likes school.	
127 people believe the school helped their child settle in well and feel their child is safe at school.	We hold induction meetings for all learners who are new to the school. The information from the meeting is shared with class teachers in advance. If you feel your child is unhappy for any reason, please contact the class teacher via the main office.
124 families feel as though their child is safe in school.	Our health and safety and safeguarding policies ensure learners are safe. If you have any safety concerns, please in form the school.
The majority of responses feel the school deals with incidents of bullying and harassment well.	We engage with the national anti-bullying week each year. School takes all matters of bullying and harassment seriously and has robust systems for recording them. Please contact us if you think we are not dealing with any matter seriously enough.
93% of families felt that they are kept well informed about their child's progress.	We hold parent consultations in the autumn and spring terms and provide written reports to parents every summer. If you have any concerns over your child's progress please contact the main office to request a call with the class teacher.
96% of responses feel that, where required, their child receives the additional support required.	Mrs Falvey is the Additional Learning Needs (ALN) Coordinator; she is supported Mrs Furtek and Miss Hurley-Bowditch our Assistant Additional Learning Needs Coordinator. The school's ALN team can be contacted via the school email or phone if you want further advice.

Ensure children have a fruit or vegetable snack daily.




If providing a packed lunch from home, ensure it is healthy.

ALN reform update information for parents

As you may be aware, St. Andrew's is currently in the transformation process over to the new ALN system. All Additional Learning Needs in Wales now follows the new code of practice. This code was implemented in January 2022 and has been rolling out ever since.

The main changes to this new code are as follows:

- It is no longer called SEN (Special Educational Needs) it is now referred to as ALN (Additional Learning Needs)
- The new act now covers children from 0-25 years
- It involves the introduction of the Individual Development Plan (IDP) and statements of Special Educational Needs are no longer being created
- It evolves around early identification to determine needs and support as early as possible in a child's education
- It focuses on an increase of collaboration involving all people important to the young person
- It is now a bilingual system
- It has a consistent right to appeal policy

As a school we are in a positive position during this transformation process with all school years apart from 2 already transferred over. The final 2 years are year 4 and year 2, which are due to be converted this Spring and Summer term this year.

Each time a mandated cohort is discussed the ALN team at St. Andrew's will discuss a child and decide whether they require Additional Learning Provision (ALP). This is determined as to whether the support they receive is above and beyond the universal support accessed by the rest of the class.

If this decision is a **yes**, then under the new code of practice, this child is deemed to have an additional learning need and therefore requires an IDP. A meeting will be held with parents, class teachers, any relevant professionals and the ALNCo. An IDP will be produced following this meeting.

If we decide that the child **does not have ALN**, under the new code, they may still require a one-page profile with targets in which the class teacher will monitor their progress and work with them on any areas they find difficult.

At this moment in time, we currently have 286 pupils on our ALN register. 22 of which have school maintained IDPs. 38 have either a statement of special educational need, or a local authority maintained IDP, these children will either be converted over to a school maintained IDP or are in our learning resource bases.

We are excited to announce that Gwent music are offering face-to-face teaching within the school. They are offering direct tuition for brass, guitar, piano/keyboard, singing, strings and woodwind.

How to enrol your child:

Group tuition will be offered once there are sufficient enrolments for a particular instrument.

Music Tuition at St Andrew's Primary School

We have engaged the services of Gwent Music to provide music tuition in the school for the academic year 2023-24.

The following arrangements will apply for all music tuition from January 2023.

- Children will be taught individually or in small groups at the start of the new term.
- Tuition is available on Brass, Guitar, Piano, Strings, Voice & Woodwind.
- 34 sessions will be delivered over the school year.
- Group tuition is available at £65 per term, subject to availability.
- · Individual tuition is also available at a cost of
 - o £130 per term for 20-minute weekly sessions or
 - £195 per term for 30-minute weekly sessions.
- These charges apply for the academic year 2023/24.
- It may be possible, subject to availability, for your child to borrow a Gwent Music instrument.
- Low income families can apply for the Music Access Fund and can access group sessions free of charge or £65 per term for 20-minute weekly sessions or £130 per term for 30 minute weekly sessions. Please contact school for support with this.

We will offer tuition once there are sufficient enrolments for any discipline
